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Our Curriculum

At the Academy our teaching staff share a passion to raise achievement and have a clear understanding of how to develop students' learning.

This is reflected in a diverse but structured curriculum which is adapted to suit each student's needs. Our students choose their curriculum pathways at the end of Year 9 from a full complement of GCSEs, BTECs and Cambridge Nationals.

All of our students have the opportunity to study for the English Baccalaureate, giving them access to our exciting new Sixth Form facility and then on to the very best universities or world of work.

Homework

Homework is an essential part of any student's progression and teaches important skills related to future employability.

These include: organisation, meeting deadlines, independent action and developing resourcefulness.

Each student will receive a homework timetable and homework should also be recorded in a personal knowledge organiser.





Teachers have high expectations for the depth and complexity of pupils' learning. This is complemented with a consistent focus on helping pupils to overcome any personal barriers that may prevent them from accessing the demanding tasks that are set. This has been instrumental in enabling pupils to make strong progress.

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The Academy offers the very best learning resources for the students in our care. We are very proud of our state-of-the-art facilities. Classrooms are bright, modern and well equipped to provide a stimulating learning environment for our students. Our ICT facilities include a Virtual Learning Environment through which all of our students can access their learning from home. The Academy also benefits from a modern, spacious sports hall, high specification technology rooms and fully equipped science laboratories.




The Academy of St Francis of Assisi has helped me believe that the sky is the limit.


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- Our academy has seen an improvement in all measures of attainment once again as the academy continues to improve year on year.

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All Saints Sixth Form College

A joint faith college for the community and cornerstone in post 16 provision

The all new All Saints Sixth Form College is a collaboration between The Academy of St Nicholas and The Academy of St Francis of Assisi, as part of The All Saints Multi Academy Trust.

The dedicated Sixth Form College is an innovative hub for post-16 education, offering young people from all faiths high quality careers advice, UCAS guidance and pastoral support.

Students will have the opportunity to take part in the prestigious University Scholar's Programme (USP) with Trust bursaries available to high attaining students to support them through university. The dedicated Scholar's initiative will also support applications to Oxford and Cambridge, Russell Group Universities and higher level apprenticeship programmes.

Once again, there have been huge successes across A-Level and Vocational subjects which is reflective of continued improvement and success At All Saints Sixth Form College which serves students from both schools across the Trust. Particular success was seen in Art, Computer Science, History and English Language and Literature. Overall 68% of our students achieved grades at A* - C.Students studying Vocational Qualifications achieved 100% pass rate with 46% of all entries achieving Distinction or Distinction* Grades. All of our students who wanted to go to university have secured their places and 26% of them secured places to study at Russell Group universities.

At All Saints Sixth Form College we realise that every student is different. Everybody has their own talents and interests. As a College our purpose is to ensure that all our students discover, explore and reach their full potential.

Winners of a national careers award, we are committed to developing a strong community, supported by education and business links which will enable students to prosper in the competitive world of work and achieve their aspirations.

Each student will be valued as an individual. At All Saints we want all students to experience success academically and personally.

Admissions

Applications for All Years

All applications will be considered in line with the coordinated admissions scheme for the Liverpool Local Authority and our academy's Admissions Policy which is available on our website.

Applications for a place at The Academy of St Francis of Assisi

A) Parents whose children are currently in Year 6 Parents who wish to secure a place at the academy are encouraged to do so as early as possible (from September of Year 6)

Parents need to:

Apply online via www.liverpool.gov.uk and

Complete a Supplementary Form available from the academy and return it to the academy either by post or email.

B) Parents whose children are already registered at a Liverpool school.

Parents applying for a local school to school transfer to The Academy of St Francis of Assisi must contact their child's existing secondary school to discuss the proposed in year transfer application in detail. All the necessary background information requested on the Liverpool Local Authority in year application form must be provided in order for the application to be considered for a permanent place at The Academy of St Francis of Assisi.

The form must be signed by parents/carers and the existing school before being sent to the Local Authority by the current school.

The Local Authority will inform you of the outcome of your application. This process can take up to 20 school days.

C) Parents who have recently moved home or are intending to move home within the city where transport to their child's existing school is no longer practical.

Parents applying for an in year transfer in these circumstances must contact Liverpool Local Authority on 0151 233 3006 to ensure that they receive appropriate guidance.

D) New residents to the city whose children are not currently registered at a Liverpool school.

Parents applying for an in year transfer in these circumstances must contact Liverpool Local Authority on 0151 233 3006 to ensure that they receive appropriate guidance.



E) Neighbouring Local Authority residents (e.g. Sefton and Knowsley)

Neighbouring Local Authority residents who have not moved home and wish to transfer to The Academy of St Francis of Assisi must comply with the Liverpool Local Authority in year transfer arrangements, i.e. an application submitted in conjunction with their existing school.

All the necessary background information requested on the Liverpool Local Authority in year application form must be provided in order for the application to be considered as valid for a permanent place at The Academy of St Francis of Assisi.
