Expectations

There are strict rules in place for the mock exams which follow the expectations of the Academy and the national exam regulations which you can find outlined below:

- Students must remain in silence at all times in the examination hall and must not attempt to communicate with any other student.
- Students must not carry an electronic device this includes mobile phones, headphones, and
- Students must only have a transparent water bottle or pencil case (although equipment will be provided for each examination).
- Students must leave all their belongings in the designated area.

Student misconduct such as using a mobile phone during an actual GCSE exam will be reported to the examination board. This may lead to being disqualified and not receiving a grade.

It is important that students experience the same conditions during mock exams, so they are familiar with them, and gain confidence in tackling some longer exam papers.
