There is a supervised study room (C1) open from 07:40 to 08:40 every morning. Our 'Revise to 5' sessions are running daily (14:50 to 17:00) in C1. Computers are available in both sessions should students wish to use them.

We are planning a schedule of revision sessions for various subjects over the half term holiday. These sessions, led by our dedicated staff, will be designed to reinforce key concepts and exam techniques. Your child should attend these sessions to build up their confidence and enhance their academic performance.

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Exam timetable and student friendly timetable

Your child has been given a final version of their exam timetable. We have asked them to check through it and would ask you to familiarise yourself with when their exams are. They are aware that they must be in school on time every day in the build-up to the exams, and on the day of each of the exams. Late arrival may result in disqualification from the exam. Morning exams will start at 9am. Students must arrive in school ready for form time at 8.40am. Afternoon exams will start promptly at 1pm. Students will have lunch before the exam starts.

I have attached an overall schedule of exams for you to refer to at the end of the letter. The students have been given a copy of this too.

Creating a study schedule for home

You can help your child by ensuring they have a study schedule for home. Your child should assess which subjects they need to prioritise and allocate study time for each subject. You can help by ensuring they stick to the schedule, encourage regular breaks and a balanced lifestyle and celebrate your child's achievement in studying daily. If you would like a blank copy of a study schedule, please ask your child to collect one from Mr Bonnesen.

Being equipped for examinations

Whilst we will provide students if needed with equipment to take their exams, we want to encourage our students to have their own stationery and calculators. This is to help ensure students are comfortable and know how to use the equipment. All pencil cases taken into the examinations room must be clear. Calculators will be reset prior to them being used in an exam.
